Sue Hampel OAM

Kronhill Senior Lecturer in East European Jewish History at Monash University's Australian Centre for Jewish Civilisation. His areas of research specialization are East European Jewish history, the history of humanitarian aid and international development, and the history of Zionism and modern Israel.

Dr Andre Oboler

Dr Andre Oboler is a social media and online public diplomacy expert. He is CEO of the Online Hate Prevention Institute, a not-for-profit organisations that seeks to prevent harm that results from various forms of online hate including online racism and cyberbullying. He serves on the Executive of the Jewish Community Council of Victoria (JCCV) and as a Councillor on the Executive Council of Australian Jewry (ECAJ). Dr Oboler is a member of the Australian Government's delegation to the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance.

With an extensive career in Jewish education from secondary to tertiary level, Paul Forgasz is a local treasure when it comes to Jewish history. Having taught at Monash University, Paul was headmaster of the secondary school at Mount Scopus Memorial College, and helped develop the original curriculums for VCE Texts & Traditions and Religion & Society.
